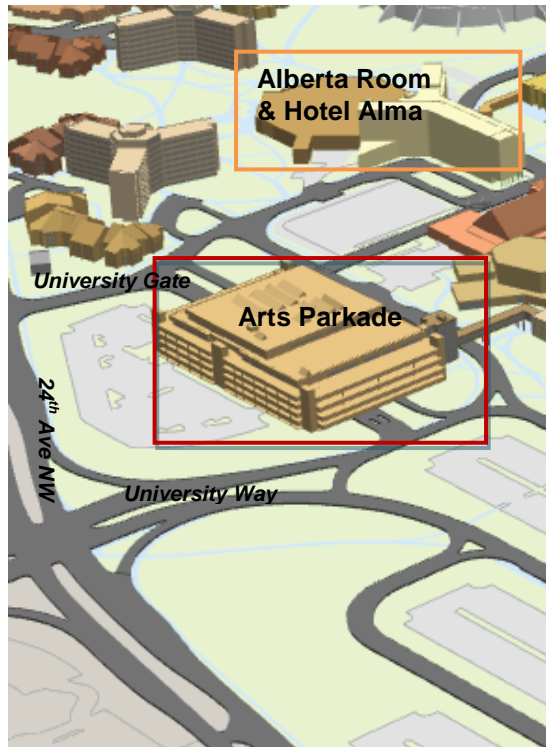


Conference Details
